

The jewel of South Louisiana,

1993, conservationists and
tour owners Frank Bonifay
and Jim Ragland rescued
1,500 acres of the swamp
from timber cutters and
preserved 901 acres in a



national non-profit organization, Bluff Swamp Wildlife Refuge & Botanical Gardens. Today they are restoring this wilderness through wildlife rehabilitation, habitat expansion and heritage eco-tours for school children.

Giant Turtles

You will be amazed by these huge, ancient alligator snapping turtles, ranging in size from 60 to 125 pounds. Their home is a sculpted, 2800-gallon concrete pool bordered by a wooden deck for maximum visibility.

You will also meet fish, snakes and other turtles during our entertaining, educational show.
